

CYPRUS CANCELS ALLIANCE TREATY

New York, April 6 (AP)

British United Nations Troops in the area came under fire for the second straight day.

In the Mediterranean, Cyprus announced cancellation of its treaty of alliance which gives Turkey the right to keep 650 troops on the island. President Makarios made the announcement in Nicosia. Cyprus says it made the decision after Turkish troops on the island refused orders to return to their barracks. After there was new fighting

Cyprus is an insoluble problem but, of course, it cannot be left instable.. Once again, it is president Makarios and the Greek Cypriote community who are precipitating the controversy. The president is trying unilaterally to terminate the treaties, with a view to compelling the Turks to withdraw their troops. Premier Inonu (of Turkey), expectedly refused at the very least Cyprus should get the three months of truce and communal peace to which president Makarios gave his agreement.

The United Nations must be given a fare chance in the interest of both Cyprus and of World Peace.

84 YEAR OLD GENERAL Dies

New York, April 6 (AP)--America-- and much of the world-- began paying a hero's homage Monday to Douglas MacArthur, gallant old soldier who has faded away.

The rugged heart of the 84-year-old general of the Army, which had kept beating through three grievous operations, was stilled at 2:30 P.M. Sunday at Walter Reed Army Hospital in Washington, D.C.

Soon thereafter the body of the man who etched his name on so much history--St. Mihiel, Bataan, Corregidor, New Guinea, Manila, Tokyo and Incheon--began a historic funeral journey into a starlit night.

The body was brought by motor hearse to this city--where he had lived in a hotel suite since coming home from the wars 13 years ago. Until Tuesday morning the body will be at the Universal Funeral Parlor from 10 A.M. Tuesday until 10 P.M.

It will lie in repose at the famous old 7th regiment armory on park avenue, a great brick building with battlements and towers, and filled with the trophies of many heroes.

On Wednesday, the body will be returned by train to Washington.

"Gen. Douglas MacArthur was a Field Commander in the old tradition of the American Army and a public administrator in a new tradition. He brought to both military command and military administration unusual qualities of mind and spirit and will, which would have made him outstanding in any field of public life. Notwithstanding that insightful and witty remark upon his return from Japan, The Old Soldier, at long last did die, but he did not and will not "Fade Away" as long as men remember his Battle Triumphs enshrined forever in the annals of The United States Army.

WOMEN JURISTS

ROLOGNA, ITALY, APRIL 6 (AP) The international Congress of Women Jurists has elected Yvonne Tolman Gouillards, a lawyer from Paris, as its new president. She succeeds Mrs. Ernest Henrion, Attorney at the Court of Appeals in Brussels.

The election came at the end of the meeting Sunday. The Congress selected Warsaw for its next gathering in 1967.

It also voted to admit Women's Jurist Federations from Hungary and Greece.

WASHINGTON, APRIL 6 (AP) Alabama Governor George Wallace's Wisconsin Primary Election bid highlights a week of political activity in the U.S. That also will include selection in three other states of delegates to the National Nominating Conventions. Wallace, challenging the Johnson Administration's Civil Rights Program, goes up against John W. Reynolds.

Wallace has been campaigning against the Johnson Administration Civil Rights Bill now before the Senate. Political leaders of both parties will be watching closely to see what impact the Legislation may have had on the Northern States voters.
